"	<u>II.</u> 16.	8pm.	The following Officers, N.C.O's and men distinguished themselves in the taking of REGINA TRENCH - Lieut's Lowe, Murphy and Dewar., Sergt.Phillpott, Sergt.Moore, Corpl.Ellis, Corpl.Rolph, L/Cpl.Hefferman, Pte.Belliveau, Sergt.Wright, Pte Atkinson, and Pte.Cliff., L/Sgt.F.H.Clarke. Pte.J.Whan, L/Cpl.W.Berry. Recommendations for recognition in the cases of Lieut.Lowe., Sergt. Phillpott, Corpl.Rolph, and Pte.Cliff. are being submitted, (Appendix No.V).	HJD. HJD.
"	<u>II.</u> 16.	8pm.	Work this day consisted of out fitting and inspections. During the inspection of the Battn., the enemy shelled ALBERT and a shell struck the billets occupied by the Machine Gun Section completely wrecking it, and wounding two men.	
"	<u>II.</u> 16.	8pm.	No.427386.Pte.J.D.Burns, severely - since died of wounds. No.472536.Pte.W.Atkinson, wounded.	
"	<u>II.</u> 16.	8pm.	A work party of fifty men under an Officer were sent to POZIERES today.	HJD.
"	<u>II.</u> 16.	8pm.	Still in billets in ALBERT. Furnished work party of two Officers and fifty men and carried out two hours training. Received notification from Brigade that the Battalion may be called upon for Operations soon to take place.	
"	<u>II.</u> 16.	8pm.	"A"Co., proceeded to the Chalk Pits at 10.a.m., and goes into the line tonight in support of the 44th.Battn. According to notice from Brigade each Battn will go into the line for forty-eight hours with one company of another Battalion in Support. Seven machine guns with crews accompanied "A"Co., During the early evening our billets in ALBERT were shelled, but not casualties occurred.	HJD.
"	<u>II.</u> 16.	8pm.	"B"Co., <del>was</del> proceeded to Chalk Pits at 4.p.m., today.	HJD. HJD.
"	<u>II.</u> 16.	8pm.	Early this morning orders were received to move the Battn to Xlla., and this was carried out by 11.a.m., and the Companies were quartered in the CHALK PITS. At 2.p.m., orders were received to move up to SUGAR TRENCH where B.H.Q., is now stationed. This move was made to place the Battalion in immediate support to the front line where an unsettled condition now prevails owing to the incomplete success of the attack carried out at 6.10.a.m., today. All ten Lewis Machine Guns are in the Line and reserve specialists are called up to Xlla. In this attack "A"Co., and 50 men of "B"Co., took part. They were formed into one company under Major McLean, Lieut.Guest, and Lt.Gyles, and were placed under orders of O.C., 50th.Battn., for the attack. The Company was formed into two waves and was given as objective the new GERMAN	HJD.
