M.35.c.2.8. 3 Coys. M.30.c.90.15. to M.36.c.8.8. Coy. H.Q. M.36.c.55.95. and M.30.c.80.07. 1 Platoon Sandpit at M.36.c.3.7. 2 Platoons Brickstacks, M.36.a.0.7. Coy H.Q. Brickstacks, M.36.a.0.7. 1.L.A.R. Post at M.36.a.75.60. 1.L.A.R. Post and Bombing Post at Subway M.30.c.9.2. Battn. Hqrs. M.35.a.5.4 & M.35.a.6.2. In this new position the 47th. Battalion is on our Right, the 50th. Battalion in support, and the 44th. Battalion in Reserve at QUARRIES and KINGS CROSS. The 1st. Battn. 6th. N. Staffordshires Regt. is on our Left, and N. of SOUCHEZ RIVER. The enemy artillery was not unusually active during the day. The weather was very good for observation, and our own and enemy planes were active throughout the day. Our planes are flying to-night. Lieut. Martin reported to the Unit from the 19th. Reserve Battalion to-day. Casualties as follows were reported to-day:- 472915 Pte. McNeil F.G. Killed. 911056 Pte. Evans R.W. Wounded. 472026 Sgt. Palmer J. Wounded. 427715 Pte. Fraser J.G. Wounded. 472718 Pte. Hoskins H.D. Wounded.		
do	2-5-17.11	p.m.	Situation today has been normal. Much aeroplane activity was noticed and several enemy machines came over our lines at intervals during the day. Enemy artillery has been normal throughout the day. Appx. No. 1. is Operation Order for a proposed minor operation to be carried out night of 2nd/3rd May 1917. Operation as outlined in Appendix No. 1. was carried out at 12-30 a.m. and objectives were gained. Appendix No. 2. is C.O.s report to the 10th. C.I.B. of this operation and line of posts referred to in Appendix No. 2. was established. During the afternoon parties were sent forward to investigate points at M.36.b.05.75. and M.30.d.15.40 and later one Platoon of C. Coy was advanced to hold the road between these two points. Little or no opposition was met with in taking up this position but later the section held was heavily shelled by enfilade fire, and Machine Guns became unusually active from the direction of FOSSE S. Lieut. P.J. Philpott was wounded during this Strafe and his Platoon in this advanced position suffered casualties. Capt G.D. Lee was killed by a sniper about 4 p.m. this afternoon while the advanced position was being taken up. One Platoon "D" Coy was sent up from Support and reinforced C. Coy. Enemy artillery was very active from 8 p.m. on Front Line and back areas. B. and C. Coys suffered casualties during this Strafe which ceased at 2 a.m. 4-5-1917.		<i>Tom.</i>
